



South Lyon Community Schools is pleased to share that all of our schools are in the top 30% of schools statewide and that Brummer Elementary has been named a Reward School again this year! Our district's assessment scores are consistently above the state averages and at or above the averages for Oakland County.

The current model for the state's overall assignment of a color status heavily relies on a district's results for its subgroups of learners. We are aware of our achievement gaps and have dedicated significant time and resources toward research-based strategies to narrow our gaps. We are proud of the work we are doing to improve educational outcomes for not only our overall student population, but specifically for students with disabilities, students who are economically disadvantaged, and students who are English Language Learners. Our commitment to a high quality educational experience for all learners will continue.

While these subgroups of learners are continuing to make progress, in many cases the subgroups did not meet growth targets set by the state for our district. This resulted in some schools and the district receiving an overall color status of yellow or orange.

South Lyon uses state assessment scores and the information contained within the scorecard as a few of the many data points we consider when we plan for instruction and interventions. We are looking forward to a consistent state assessment system and scorecard practices in order to be able to meaningfully use the information contained within the scorecard.
